The Department of Linguistics, established in 1985, has been actively engaged in advanced research and teaching, offering M.A. and Ph.D. programmes in Linguistics. Alongside its academic work, the department undertakes socially relevant extension activities in areas such as tribal literacy, adult literacy, and teacher training. Its M.A. Linguistics programme is innovative, combining core and applied linguistics with unique interdisciplinary supportive papers that attract students from science backgrounds.



GLIMPSE OF DEPARTMENT'S ACADEMIC JOURNEY ACROSS 4 DECADES

The department reached several significant milestones in its academic journey. It successfully completed two phases of the UGC-SAP-DRS programme, focusing on the language and culture of indigenous communities of the Western Ghats, and received the prestigious Endangered Languages Scheme from the UGC. A collaboration with the University of Malaya, an outbound program for Malaysian students to undergo linguistics training availing the service of its faculty and eminent Indian linguists. It has been conducting academic events regularly, including National, International Conferences and Workshops, Orientation Programmes, using the service of Internationally Trained Faculty. Member's This iconic department continues to be a vibrant Centre for linguistic scholarship. Knowledge dissemination

To date, The department has published 55 books and 3 monographs, produced 139 Ph.D. and 50 M.Phil. scholars, and annually publishes an International peer reviewed Journal in the name of 'Working Papers in Linguistics and Literature' (UGC-CARE listed for 3 years) and Students' Newsletter 'Voice of Linguistic Novices'. It hosts the 'Telugu Chair' for research on Telugu-speaking minorities in the Coimbatore region. The department completed around 30 major /minor research projects funded by UGC, RUSA, ICSSR, CIIL, and others. It has been organizing weekly Research Circle Meeting, called Saussure's Knowledge Factory for budding linguists. It has conducted over 100 international and national seminars, conferences, and workshops.

The Linguistic Society of India is a body of intellectuals working on languages and promotion of Linguistics. The Society has been in existence since 1928 and built a strong network of Linguistics scholars. Over the years, LSI has also become a household name among the linguists of this country. So far, the society has organised 47 events, and the 48th one is being organized this year.

ICOLSI is the flagship conference of the Linguistic Society of India and is held annually. CONFERENCE THEME: **EXPLORING THE UNEARTHED SYSTEM OF SYSTEMS IN LINGUISTICS**

This conference adopts the theme **“Exploring the Unearthed System of Systems in Linguistics”** to encourage a deeper understanding of language as a complex network of interconnected systems. Linguistics traditionally examines various subsystems such as phonetics, phonology, morphology, syntax, semantics, pragmatics, discourse, and sociolinguistics. However, these components do not function in isolation; rather, they interact dynamically to form a broader system of language. The theme invites scholars to uncover and examine these often-overlooked interrelationships, revealing how linguistic structures, cognitive processes, social contexts, cultural practices, and technological developments collectively shape human communication. By exploring language as a “system of systems,” the conference aims to foster interdisciplinary dialogue, innovative theoretical perspectives, and new methodologies that contribute to a more comprehensive understanding of language, its evolution, and its role in society.

NON-THEMATIC SESSIONS

In addition to the thematic sessions, the conference will also include non-thematic sessions covering a wide range of topics in linguistics. These sessions are open to all areas of linguistic research, including but not limited to phonetics, phonology, morphology, syntax, semantics, pragmatics, sociolinguistics, psycholinguistics, computational linguistics, historical linguistics, and allied areas of linguistics. We encourage submissions that present innovative research, theoretical insights, and empirical findings across the diverse spectrum of linguistic inquiry. These sessions aim to provide a platform for scholars to share their work and engage in discussions spanning the breadth of linguistic studies.

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Abstract submissions must be anonymised and uploaded through **'EasyAbs'** (<https://easyabs.linguistlist.org/conference/ICOLSI-48/>). This practice promotes a fair, transparent and constructive assessment process by enabling reviewers to evaluate submissions solely on their academic merit. Abstract for oral presentations on any original and unpublished research on all aspects of theoretical, applied and interdisciplinary linguistics. Scholars and academicians are encouraged to submit abstracts of their papers in about 250-300 words in any of the related areas in PDF/Docx format. To ensure fairness for all participants, the conference will permit **only one first-author submission per participant**. For every paper accepted for oral, at least one author must complete an individual conference registration.

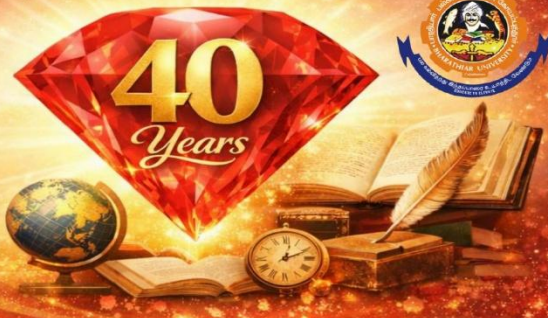
